Dear Mr. Shelley:

On December 23, 2013 the Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) received an application from Freeport-McMoRan Chino, Inc. (Chino) requesting a modification to the Chino Mine permit. The proposed permit modification is requesting a reduction in the amount of financial assurance ("FA") required for implementation of the closeout plan for the Chino Mine. Specifically, in accordance with § 19.10.12.1210 NMAC, Chino is requesting a partial release of financial assurance ("FA") in the amount of \$4,682,716 for successful reclamation work completed at the Tailing Ponds 1, 2, and 4 (4 West, and 4 East).

Pursuant to § 19.10.12.1210.A.4 and § 19.10.5.505.B.3 NMAC, MMD provided notice of the proposed modification and partial FA release to the appropriate state agencies and interested parties requesting their review and comments on the proposal. A site visit was conducted January 29, 2014 affording those state agencies and interested parties an opportunity to view the completed reclamation work. A copy of all agency comments, and comments received from Gila Resource Information Project, are attached for your review and records. Please note the request for records made in the comment letter received from Office of State Engineer.

Please note that 19.10.12.1210.D NMAC requires the Director of MMD to notify the Permittee of the decision whether to release all or a part of the FA, requested to be released, within 45 days of the inspection, if no public hearing is held pursuant to 19.10.12.1210.C NMAC. You are hereby being notified that the Director of MMD has determined that the Modification 13-1 proposal for a partial FA release is approvable. Chino should proceed with preparing, and submitting to MMD, a Certificate of Face Amount Adjustment to the third-party guarantee to complete the partial FA release. Once this has been accomplished MMD will be able to complete the approval of the partial release modification.

In response to your letter dated January 27, 2014, the New Mexico Department of Game and Fish (Department) has reviewed the document referenced above. Freeport-McMoRan Chino Inc. seeks a partial release of financial assurance for reclamation conducted on Tailings Ponds 1, 2 and 4 (4 West and 4 East). Department staff did not conduct a site inspection related to this request.

Stormwater channels on the top surfaces are lined with Gila conglomerate and limestone riprap. Horizontal channels on the outslopes are constructed using riprap. Spillways where these channels meet and discharge off the corners of the tailings ponds are constructed of articulated concrete block. The stormwater conveyance system as a whole appears to be robust. The state will retain enough funds to reseed the Tailings Ponds if necessary.

As required by the Closeout Plan conditions (part of the Mining and Minerals Division permit), a wildlife habitat feature has been constructed on the reclaimed areas. The rockpile on the tailings pond top surface is constructed in a V shape to block the wind, and large boulders were used with various three-dimensional gaps. Wildlife use of this and other features may be limited until vegetation becomes established because it is distant from existing undisturbed habitat. The federal Office of Surface Mining recommends an average of one rockpile feature per 80 acres of reclaimed habitat.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on this permit modification. No significant adverse impact to wildlife or important habitat is expected to result from partial release of financial assurance as requested. 

On December 23, 2013 the Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) received an application from Freeport-McMoRan Chino, Inc. (Chino) requesting a modification to the Chino Mine permit. The application for modification is requesting a reduction in the amount of financial assurance required for implementation of the closeout plan for the Chino Mine. Specifically, in accordance with § 19.10.12.1210 NMAC, Chino is requesting that the financial assurance be reduced for reclamation work completed at the Tailing Ponds 1, 2, and 4 (4 West, and 4 East).

Pursuant to § 19.10.12.1210.A.4 and § 19.10.5.505.B.3 NMAC, you are hereby notified that MMD has received an application from Chino for a partial release of the financial assurance for the Chino Mine; and MMD is requesting comments from your agency for the application for modification (partial financial assurance release) of the Chino Mine Permit No. GR009RE. Chris,

New Mexico Office of the State Engineer (NMOSE) Hydrology Bureau has reviewed the Modification 13-1 requested by Freeport McMoRan Chino Inc. (Chino) – MMD Permit No. GR0009RE.

On January 27, 2014, MMD requested review and comment of this modification for partial financial assurance (FA) release. This partial FA release is related to reclamation work completed at Tailing Ponds 1, 2 and 4 (4 West and 4 East) southeast of Hurley, NM. NMOSE reviewed the modification request. NMOSE Hydrology staff did not attend the field inspection on January 29, 2014, yet staff have been on site as recently as 2012.

- 1. OSE supports the reduction of third party guarantee financial instrument for this partial FA release of approximately \$4.83 M (2003 dollars) or \$4.68 M NPV.
- 2. In order to have a complete picture of the changes to wells, NMOSE requests a summary table of wells modified due to reclamation of Tailing Ponds 1, 2 and 4. Specifically, which wells have been plugged, replaced (or will be replaced) or modified (e.g., extended casing). For example, plugging plans of operation have been filed with NMOSE District 3 for points of diversion (PODs): M-10670-POD8 (Chino well number 214-05-03), M-10670-POD10 (Chino well number 214-05-05), and M-10170-POD96 (Chino well DM-16-SR). At a minimum, the summary table should include the final disposition, NMOSE POD number (& Chino well number) and location of each well that was modified due to reclamation at the older tailings area.

Dear Mr. Eustice:

Thank you for including the Gila Resources Information Project (GRIP), as represented by Rebecca Summer, on the January 29, 2014 inspection tour of the Chino mine Tailings Ponds 1, 2 and 4. We feel it is important for local citizens to understand the importance, the magnitude and complexity of the reclamation being implemented at local mines. We appreciate the opportunity to see first-hand the reclamation work performed by Freeport-McMoRan (FMI).

GRIP concurs with the financial assurance (FA) release taken from the third party guarantee rather than the cash trust to maintain certainty in the liquidity of the FA.

We also concur with the need to hold back some FA to ensure availability of funding until the revegetation work can be fully evaluated at the end of twelve years. However, is the amount of the remaining FA sufficient to cover any work that might be required to ensure that the area achieves a PMLU of self-sustaining ecosystem? Also is any FA needed to deal with potential erosion of outslopes at tailings ponds before the end of the 12 year period?

I thank you for consideration of my comments.
