GEO SOUTHWEST, LP IS APPLYING FOR THE REVISION OF THE PERMIT FOR THE DEMING MILL AND MILL TAILING FACILITY TO UPDATE THE CLOSEOUT PLAN AND FINANCIAL ASSURANCE

Pursuant to the New Mexico Mining Act Rules, 19.10.5 and 19.10.9.903A NMAC, Geo Southwest, Ltd *dba* Geo Southwest, LP in New Mexico (GEO) is applying to the State of New Mexico Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) for a Revision to the Deming Mill and Mill Tailings Facility Permit LU009RE to update the Closeout Plan (CP) and financial assurance MMD Permit LU009RE was modified on August 5, 2014 (permit transfer to GEO) and on September 23, 2021 (vegetation success standards).

Location of Real Property Affected: The Deming Mill is located on <u>8.0</u> acres within the Deming city limits adjoining the Deming industrial park located in the northwest part of the City. The permit area also includes 178.63 acres not within the Deming City limits but adjoining the Mill on its east side. This additional land includes the Mill Tailings on <u>72.577.267</u> acres, a borrow pit on 22.27 acres and 79.163 additional acres south of the Mill Tailings. The permit area is located entirely on private land in Sections 20, 21 and 29, Township 23 South, Range 9 West, NMPM, Luna County, New Mexico. The Mill address is 2050 Peru Mill Road NW, Deming, NM 88031.

<u>Site History</u>: ASARCO constructed the mill in 1949, and operated it for nearly 30 years with periodic shutdowns until 1979, when its primary source of lead and zinc ores, the Groundhog Mine closed. From May, 1989 until August, 1995, Phelps Dodge, Cyprus Pinos Altos Corporation leased the mill to produce copper-zinc concentrate from ore and the tailing impoundment regulated under a separate MMD permit with Freeport McMoRan Incorporated. ASARCO applied for standby of the mill in 1999.

In August, 2005, ASARCO filed for bankruptcy protection and began reclamation in 2007 of the Deming Mill Tailings. From 2009 to 2014, The ASARCO Multi-State Custodial Trust (Trust) completed reclamation of the Deming Mill Tailings and some soil cleanup at the Mill. GEO purchased 1193.84 acres from the Trust on April 10, 2014.

<u>Proposed Changes to CP</u>: GEO is requesting approval of the CP which outlines plans and estimated closeout costs of the Deming Mill and for the reclamation of a few acres of exposed tailings found on the area south of the Mill Tailings. The updated CP proposes reclaiming additional tailing by placement of soil cover and establishment of vegetation. Some smaller tailing areas may be consolidated into a few acres prior to cover placement.

If a public hearing is held, it will be advertised in accordance with 19.10.9.904 NMAC.
