The New Mexico Mining and Minerals Division (MMD) received a Mine Operations and Reclamation Plan (MORP) submittal from Roca Honda Resources, LLC, (RHR) for its proposed Roca Honda uranium mine in McKinley County, New Mexico. MMD reviewed the MORP and deemed it Administratively Complete on June 22, 2026.

The Roca Honda Mine anticipates disturbing federal, state, and private surface lands within the permit boundaries for development of an underground uranium mine located approximately 3 miles east of the community of San Mateo and approximately 17 miles northeast of the community of Grants, in McKinley County, New Mexico.
