The application proposes to use existing roads and no vehicular overland travel to minimize disturbance of Private Property (75 holes and 9 pads) and United States Forest Service Property road usage and maintenance within the boundaries of claim numbers identified in the application for exploration located approximately 13 miles west of Silver City in Grant County, New Mexico. Because Standard Silver Corp has agreed not to exceed 5 acres of total disturbance and/or exceed excavating 1000 cubic yards at all times, MMD is processing this application as a minimal impact exploration permit pursuant to §19.10.3.302 (A) NMAC.
