Dear Mr. Martinez,

This letter is in response to your correspondence dated April 21, 2014, regarding an Application for Modification 14-1 from Freeport McMoRan, Tyrone Inc., Permit No GR010RE, for a proposed update of the closeout plan for the Tyrone Mine in Grant County. The Hopi Tribe claims cultural affiliation to earlier identifiable cultural groups in New Mexico. The Hopi Cultural Preservation Office supports identification and avoidance of prehistoric archaeological sites and Traditional Cultural Properties, and we consider the archaeological sites that are habitations of our ancestors to be "footprints" and Hopi Traditional Cultural Properties. Therefore, we appreciate your continuing solicitation of our input and your efforts to address our concerns.

In the enclosed letter dated May 5, 2014, in response to your correspondence dated April 21, 2014, regarding an Application for Revision 09-1 for a proposed update of the closeout plan for the Tyrone Mine, the Hopi Cultural Preservation Office stated we are interested in consulting on any proposal in New Mexico with the potential to adversely affect prehistoric sites and we are not aware of any Traditional Cultural Properties in this project area.

We understand this proposal involves a new 56 acre waste rock stockpile. Therefore, to enable us to determine if this application may affect cultural resources significant to the Hopi Tribe, please provide us with a copy of the cultural resources survey of the area of potential effect for review and comment. If prehistoric sites are identified that may be adversely affected by project activities, we request continuing consultation on this proposal including being provided with a copies of any proposed treatment plans for review and comment.
