#### Section 1. PERMIT APPLICATION PACKAGE

- A. The Permit Application Package ("PAP") for permit transfer is comprised of:
  - 1. A letter from the Applicant requesting permit transfer, and signed by the Transferor, dated January 25, 2018;
  - 2. Administrative Complete Letter sent from MMD to Applicant, dated January 26, 2018.
  - 3. Approved Joint Surety Bond No. DVIFSU0719088 with the U.S. Forest Service from International Fidelity Insurance Company in the amount of \$33,516.00.

#### Section 2. FINDINGS OF FACT

- A. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.B NMAC, there is no public notice requirement for minimal impact permit transfers.
- B. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.D(1) NMAC, the Applicant has provided financial assurance in the form of a Surety Bond with International Fidelity Insurance Company, Surety Bond No. DVIFSU0719088 in the amount of \$33,516.00.
- C. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.D(2), the Applicant agrees to continue to conduct the operations involved, in full compliance with the New Mexico Mining Act ("Act"), the New Mexico Mining Act Rules ("Rules"), and the terms and conditions of the Permit No. SA004MN, as may be revised or modified from time to time.
- D. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.D(3) NMAC, the Applicant would be eligible to receive a permit for new mines in accordance with Section 69-36-12.B(5) of the New Mexico Mining Act.
- E. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.D(4), the Applicant has paid the permit transfer fee of \$250.00.
- F. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.E NMAC, this permit transfer notifies the current Transferor, the Applicant and the owner of the mineral estate (United States Forest Service), of the Director's findings.
- G. Pursuant to §19.10.8.802.F NMAC, the Applicant has provided notice to the Director of the consummation of the transaction transferring the South Pit Mine from Transferor to Transferee.
- H. This Permit Transfer does not grant or create any property or water rights. Nor does MMD, by issuing this Permit Transfer or otherwise, make any comment on the surface, mineral or water rights that the Applicant may or may not have in the area covered by the Permit; only that the Applicant has provided a statement of the basis on which the Applicant has a right-to-enter the property to conduct mining, exploration and reclamation. Applicant is solely responsible to take whatever steps are necessary to ensure that Applicant has property and water rights sufficient to support the activities contemplated by the Permit.
