State Parks to remain closed through April 30th

Santa Fe – The statewide public health order has been <u>extended through April 30th</u>. In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and as directed by the Governor, the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) announces the following changes in office access and the extension of State Parks closures. EMNRD has shifted as many employees to telework as possible.

EMNRD Headquarters - Wendell Chino Building

Most staff with offices in EMNRD's Wendell Chino Building headquarters in Santa Fe are teleworking. Access to the building is by appointment only for limited circumstances when important business cannot be conducted remotely.
