## **EMNRD launches new website**

The previous EMNRD website had not been updated since 2012. The new website aims to present our important work and data in a more user-friendly way.

Built by Albuquerque-based web software company [Real Time Solutions](#), the new website is responsive to mobile devices, translates content into Spanish and six other languages, and is easy to update. The new website’s navigation highlights EMNRD’s issue areas so the public can get a better sense of the Department’s priorities, responsibilities, and programs.

The new design and layout are transparent and the entire website has been modernized from back to front,” said EMNRD Cabinet Secretary Sarah Cottrell Propst. “We encourage the public to explore the new site and provide suggestions on how to keep improving this living document, new contact forms have been implemented throughout to give the public additional ways to get in touch with EMNRD.”
