Mr. Fuge holds degrees in Geology and Studies in the Environment from Yale University and earned his Law Degree and a Masters of Environmental Management from Duke University.

"My previous work on natural resources and public lands is a perfect fit for the large scope of the Department and I look forward to joining this dedicated team committed to improving New Mexico."
