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Additional details on upcoming Oil Conservation Commission natural gas waste reduction rules hearing

Santa Fe, NM – Beginning January 4, 2021 the Oil Conservation Commission (OCC) will hold a hearing on the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department's proposed rules on reducing natural gas waste. Additional details on the proposed rules and how to attend the hearing and submit public comments are provided below.

The proposed rules include the following key elements:

- Midstream and upstream operators must capture 98 percent of their natural gas by the end of 2026.
- Operators must report gas loss at every stage of the oil and gas value chain. Operators
 that do not meet their gas capture targets may not be able to obtain drilling permits or
 start drilling wells and may face enforcement actions.
- Operators of stripper wells will have flexibility to meet the requirements for inspections and equipment retrofits, but they are not exempted from the gas capture targets.
- Routine venting and flaring is prohibited.

The public comment process began November 24th and there are multiple ways for members of the public to submit comments on the proposed rules. Written comments can be submitted through 5:00 pm on January 8, 2021. To allow members of the public to make a public comment at the hearing, the OCC is scheduling 2-minute timeslots during portions of the hearing schedule. To speak during the hearing, submit a request to Florene Davidson, OCC Clerk, at the email address above by 5:00 p.m. on January 3, 2021. The OCC will take public comments all day on January 4, the morning of January 5, and from 8:30-9:00 and 4:30-5:00 January 6-8 and January 11-15.
