First of all I want to say that I'm a user of NM State Parks, and am consistently impressed with the maintenance, upkeep, and amenities of our state parks as well as the outstanding staff in our parks.

I have been frustrated on numerous occasions when trying to stay at a park and not always being able to reserve a spot in advance, and finding it full when we arrive. But I don't have a good suggestion for how to fix that either.

As far as fee changes, I support increases, even though they will impact me. I want to suggest that camping and other fees for non-residents be raised even higher, even if it's largely a symbolic difference such as an additional \$5.00. The taxes of residents subsidize our parks (which I'm fine with), so I think it's fair to ask non-residents to pay a little more.

I am curious about fees for utilities, I am totally self-sufficient in my teardrop camper, and have no need for utilities. Paying \$4 is an inconvenience, but it supported State Parks. A \$10 fee for utilities, along with \$20 instead of \$10 for a site, is getting pricey for something I don't need. Including a "I won't use utilities" check box on the site registration card and imposing a \$100 fee for using them after making the assertive claim on the form could accommodate this concern, although it might encourage the use of generators, which I abhor!

I am a Veteran and Senior citizen, and would like to see an annual camping pass option for those categories. It's not about the \$\$, it's the principal. I understand your position regarding people abusing stays, but this could be solved (IMHO) by imposing a 5 or 10 day park stay limit. FWIW, I deeply appreciate the veterans discount I get on my fishing license every year.

I have a (homebuilt) kayak and won't enjoy the \$5.00 launch fee, but I understand and support it.

Again, I enjoy our State Parks, support what you're doing with them, and want to extend thanks and appreciation from my family to your park staff for all they do.
