I'm a senior NM resident and have used the ACP...not abused it.

It seems responsible that residents should be offered a lower camping fee vs non-residents. This is easy to implement since NM uses Reserve America for all reservations. Break for seniors?

It's unclear to me in the executive summary if the \$10 utility fee would be for each, water, electric, and sewer, meaning that a full hook up site would total \$50. That's crazy.

Include the \$10 dump station fee in any reservation made for RV's TT's,etc and if reserved for more than 7 days,make the fee \$20. Trying to collect the fee at the Point-of-Sale seems like the same problem as collecting day use fees.Honor system would be a joke.

I use Navajo Lake most often and I've NEVER experienced any sort of enforcement of rules infractions...meaning if you increase fees there should be an increase in service.

Texas does not charge a reservation fee via Reserve America, our \$12 charge for 4 or more days is the highest I'm aware of....and to not get it refunded when a park gets closed is robbery.

On a related subject, the NM rules on reservation changes are unclear. Every time I've called(can't do it online)!, I get a different answer...very confusing. Should be done online.
