I hope these comments do get posted.

1. Increases are substantial. They should be staged if possible.

2. In state annual camping passes should be maintained. Fee increase should depend on changes to electric/water fee.

3. \$20 for electric and water is too much. It will quadruple electric fee in most sites. A \$10 fee would be acceptable provided in state annual passes aren't increased too much.

4. Increase in primitive campsite fee is too high especially where sites don't have bathrooms with showers.

5. Retain day fees and annual day fee passes.

6. Keep some non reservation sites. This may increase revenue. For example I often went to a non reservation site at Navajo Dam and stayed for 2 weeks. Often very hard to do since many sites are reserved for weekends.
