Four State Parks to re-open after temporary closures due to extreme fire conditions and national forest closures

Santa Fe, NM – The Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD) State Parks Division announces that Cimarron Canyon, Fenton Lake, Hyde Memorial, and Manzano Mountains State Parks will re-open to the public for day-use on Friday, June 24th and for camping Monday, June 27th.

Two State Parks – Morphy Lake, Pecos Canyon – will remain closed at this time due to impacts from the Calf Canyon/Hermits Peak Fire. All New Mexico State Parks have implemented the [EMNRD State Forester Fire Restriction Order 2022-02](#), which prohibits smoking, fireworks, campfires, open burning, and open fires on all non-municipal, nonfederal, and non-tribal lands statewide.
